We were able to visit each other on my base or on his ship which really took some effort since I was in the Air Force attached to a Army base for shipping people overseas and his ship was at dock in a Marine controlled area. You know, a navy dressed man visiting an Army base and an Air Force dressed man visiting a Navy ship. Getting accommodations and eating at each others base/port became an adventure to say the least. Sunny boy and I kept in touch over the years and enjoyed going over the memories we made together even up to the time he became very sick. I know that he will be missed by his family and friends.
