Howard Ryan Brown had a full, meaningful and honorable life that ended November 8, 2025.

Born to Ralph and Beatrice Brown in Los Angeles on December 10, 1956, he was raised in Los Angeles and Emmaus, Pennsylvania.

He graduated from Admiral Farragut Academy in Tom's River, NJ in 1975. Enlisting in the Navy Reserve, serving eight years, he at one point was the youngest lieutenant commander in Navy Reserve history. He later joined the US Coast Guard Reserves for twelve years of service as a port security specialist. He was called up for active service multiple times, including after 9/11. Between the reserves service and after, he was active in the Coast Guard Auxiliary.

Having resided in California, Pennsylvania, New Jersey, Nevada, Mississippi, Louisiana, Michigan and Arizona, he had friends everywhere.

Ryan loved boating, flying planes and helicopters, music, motorcycles, participating in Renaissance festivals, officiating weddings, and a good conversation.

His career path always revolved around law enforcement. For over thirty years he wore badges...at the local, state or federal levels. Protecting his family and

community was paramount in his nature.

He had multiple advanced degrees in theology and Christian counseling.

Community involvement included memberships in American Legion, the Navy Sea Cadet Corps, volunteer fire fighters, Fraternal Order of Police, the International Police Association, VFW auxiliary, and others.

Ryan was preceded in death by his parents, and his younger son H.R. II (Robert Carlisle.)

He is survived by his wife of twenty six years, Barbara; his beloved daughter, Alison Geyer of Idaho and her significant other, Carlos Martinez; son, Christopher Carlisle of New York State; and grandson, Franklin Richardson, Jr. in Arizona. He also leaves behind cousin, Jackie Schuster; in-laws Jody and Joe Thomas; and Jeanne Drew, in Michigan.
