She was the founder and first Chairperson for the first Fourth Of July Festival in the early 2000's when the fireworks launch site was moved back to the Fairgrounds. She loved creating events for her community. Viola enjoyed playing video games, so much so that her kids and grandkids called her to get advice on playing games. Her grandkids bragged to their friends that their Grandmother was an amazing gamer. She was honestly one of the most active people ever until she fell ill in 2017. Viola's favorite thing in this world was spending time with her kids and grandkids. She was known as a hard working lady. To support her family Viola held many positions through the years at several businesses throughout Kingman.

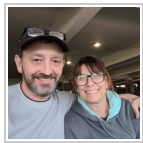

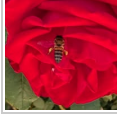
